

Longing for a Righteous King

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In the previous week I demonstrated how we can look back in time and confirm dates and traditions using the sun and the moon, according to the Torah.

I also talked about the two "tequfot," or rather "turns," involved in the yearly cycle.

Well yesterday was the fall tequfah, also known as the Fall Equinox. The Equinox occurred at 9:04 pm EST Thursday night, which actually placed it in Day 6 of the week according to Hebrew reckoning.

Talk about a turn. The weather in New York went from sunny 80's, to wet and windy 40's and 50's. That's what I call a turn – right on que. And that demonstrates the significant role that the equinox plays in our reckoning of time and perception of the seasons. It is a turning point built into creation, because it is controlled by the movements of the heavenly bodies.

When we follow the signs provided in the Scriptures, we see the corresponding results, like the weather changes.

We see green barley appear in the month of the aviv. The barley does not control the calendar, it is simply the result of being on the Creator's calendar using the two great lights.

That is one of the incredible benefits of diligently obeying the Commandments. We get needed confirmation, and we stay on the straight path. I travelled to the land of Israel for two decades, and saw the Calendar confirmed by the harvests.

When you follow the Commandments, YHWH is faithful to provide His promises. When we add to them, and take away from them, we go astray.

While looking to the barley before making a determination of Month 1 may seem like a valid exercise, it is simply not Scriptural. It is a tradition that cannot be tested or confirmed in a way that I demonstrated in the last message

People assume that since a barley offering is made during Unleavened Bread that we must have "aviv" barley before the beginning of Month 1.

Of course, the Scriptures never say that the barley controls time, and they never tell us to delegate barley inspection teams to scour the land looking for "aviv" barley prior to the renewed moon.

Further, the Scriptures never define "aviv" barley, because the month of "the aviv" is not specifically referring to barley, but rather the month when new life springs forth - ie. spring.

Therefore, the barley traditions are quite presumptuous and misleading.

We must be careful about our assumptions, because they can skew our outlook on the Scripture, and the future plan of Elohim.

Many of us have grown up in the Christian religion and carry assumptions about future prophetic events that actually derive from Jesuit deceptions.

In fact, people have inherited traditions and assumptions about events preceding the return of the Messiah that may be absolutely incorrect. The problem is that it is so ingrained, they confuse the theory or idea with truth.

I'm making plans to travel to Israel for Sukkot, and may be taking people to view some interesting sites.

One popular tourist site is the Garden Tomb. I often take people there so that they can see an example of a tomb, but I make certain to warn them that there is no real evidence to connect that with the tomb Yahushua was placed in.

I am well aware of the Ron Wyatt claims nearby regarding the crucifixion location, but the site of the Garden Tomb is pure speculation.

While the curators have developed the site into a very peaceful and tranquil setting, there is no indication that it was ever a garden in the past.

Nevertheless, some people have turned it into a holy site, and thousands of sincere Christians flock there, believing it is the very spot that Yahushua was buried and later resurrected.

Of course, you can witness the same thing from Orthodox Christians at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

The word Sepulcher means: “a tomb or a burial place.”

This is the traditional site, dating back to the 4th century, that includes the location of the crucifixion, the anointing of the body and the location of the tomb.

In this case there is no tomb, only a sepulcher that was constructed to commemorate the presumed spot.

In either case, the locations contemplate the burial of Yahushua after His death.

The King Messiah was falsely accused by His own people, then sentenced to death. He was tortured, harangued and brutally executed on a stake.

His body was then hurriedly taken down from the stake, anointed, wrapped, and sealed in a cave. Here is the account of that event.

“³⁸ Later, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Yahushua. Now Joseph was a disciple of Yahushua, but secretly because he feared the Jewish leaders. With Pilate’s permission, he came and took the body away. ³⁹ He was accompanied by Nicodemus, the man who earlier had visited Yahushua at night. Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds. ⁴⁰ Taking Yahushua’s body, the two of them wrapped it, with the spices, in strips of linen. This was in accordance with Jewish burial customs. ⁴¹ At the place where Yahushua was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had ever been laid. ⁴² Because it was the Jewish day of Preparation and since the tomb was nearby, they laid Yahushua there.”
John 19:38-42

There was no fanfare or extravagant ceremony. In fact, other than the two witnesses to His burial, namely Joseph and Nicodemus, there is no mention of anyone else to honor the King when He was laid to rest.

Now contrast that to the recent funeral of Queen Elizabeth II.

I was up at 4:30 am Monday morning doing some writing when I received a notification on my phone that her funeral was about to begin. I decided to turn on the television and watch, since it was a historic event.

The first hymn got my attention because I had been trying to remember the name for over two years since I started moving to Texas. The church in the Presidio nearby played the song on their bells every night and I remembered singing it as a kid in church.

No one knew the name of it, not even the people at the church! So when I tuned in and heard it, I couldn't believe it. The day thou gavest, Lord, is ended. Finally. Mystery solved. Thank you Queen Elizabeth!

As I continued to watch, I was struck by all of the precision and detail that went in to this dramatically choreographed event.

It was probably the most elaborate funeral I have seen in my lifetime.

I remember the funeral of Ronald Reagan, which was certainly expensive and grand, but it paled in scale and scope to the pomp and pageantry of the Queen's funeral, which was actually a military operation dubbed Operation London Bridge.

It is my understanding that the Queen herself worked on the plans for decades, since the 1960's, which makes you wonder what it would have looked like if she hadn't planned it.

Would people put that much attention into her funeral if she had not choreographed it herself?

Well, the monarch wanted it to be elaborate. She left instructions for her followers, and she definitely got what she wanted.

You could see that those who watched and participated were very sincere in their devotion and admiration of the Queen.

I'm glad that I watched it because it's not something you see every day. Especially in America, where we revolted against this very monarchy centuries ago.

Despite Americas origins in dealing with a tyrannical monarchy, it has ultimately fallen prey to greedy, self-interested politicians, and is currently in a state of serious decline and collapse as we speak.

America was a grand experiment, but it relied on a morally sound and fiercely independent populace that was willing to fight and protect their freedoms.

Currently, the United States has become polarized into special interest groups and factions all seeking their piece of the pie. Forgotten are the founding principles of free speech, free and independent press and unfettered gun ownership.

Now, only politically correct speech is tolerated. Everything else gets censored by the majority of the media outlets that are aligned with the technocratic beast system that is engulfing the planet. The next big move is to take away the guns so that the population can become completely subjugated, and unable to resist.

The United States of America is no longer united, and America is a faint whisper of what it was meant to be, because it has lost its course.

The States have succumbed to the power of an ever-increasing Federal Government which has literally become a hammer that will beat its populace into submission, and bleed them dry in order to grow in power, and spend itself into oblivion.

The Federal Government then carries that hammer throughout the world to beat other nations into submission for their resources.

The land of the free and home of the brave is quickly becoming the land of the slaves, and the home of the over-taxed and exhausted masses. (At least the ones who are not feeding at the government trough.)

It happens to every republic, and it was inevitable to occur with this republic.

That is why I have long held that I would rather have a righteous King rule over me than an elected politician.

Sadly, an examination of the history of Yisrael, as provided through 1 and 2 Kings, as well as 1 and 2 Chronicles, reveals that the odds are against us there as well.

Incredibly, YHWH was originally the King of Yisrael, but the people weren't satisfied. They wanted a king, like the nations around them.

This was not a surprise. YHWH foretold this would happen through Moses.

"¹⁴ When you come to the Land which YHWH your Elohim is giving you, and possess it and dwell in it, and say, 'I will set a king over me like all the nations that are around me,' ¹⁵ you shall surely set a king over you whom YHWH your Elohim chooses; one from among your brethren you

shall set as king over you; you may not set a foreigner over you, who is not your brother.” Deuteronomy 17:14-15

They went the entire span of the judges without a king. The Yisraelites coexisted as separate and independent tribes. They were supposed to stay unified through the Appointed Times by gathering at the House of YHWH three times a year. They would come and pay homage to their King at His palace, or should I say His tent.

The problem is that people stopped going.

Just prior to the birth of Shemuel we read the following:

“¹ Now there was a certain man of Ramathaim Zophim, of the mountains of Ephraim, and his name was Elkanah the son of Jeroham, the son of Elihu, the son of Tohu, the son of Zuph, an Ephraimite. ² And he had two wives: the name of one was Hannah, and the name of the other Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had no children. ³ This man went up from his city yearly to worship and sacrifice to YHWH of hosts in Shiloh. Also the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, the priests of YHWH, were there.” 1 Shemuel 1:1-3

The continuing account reveals that the priesthood, and the Tabernacle were corrupted. The sons of the High Priest Eli were profaning the offerings that people presented, and he did not stop them.

The people didn't want to make offerings that would be stolen and defiled. The numbers ended up dwindling which resulted in separation from each other, and separation from YHWH.

As a result, YHWH called Shemuel as a child to serve Him. He allowed His Mishkan (Tabernacle) to be abandoned. His Ark was taken by the

Philistines and the sons of Eli were killed. Shiloh eventually became desolate, and some believe destroyed by the Philistines.

That was an abomination of desolation event, by the way.

Just like there is not one “Day of the Lord” event in the future, but many judgment events in the past; the same holds true with the mysterious “abomination of desolation” that many mistakenly place in the future.

The abomination of desolation event spoken of by Yahushua occurred in 70 CE, when the Romans later destroyed Jerusalem and the Temple. Failure to understand that is going to get you in all sorts of trouble when it comes to understanding prophecy.

Shemuel ended up being the last judge. He ended up going out to the people and his life provides many patterns for Messiah Yahushua. It is particularly poignant that he was the prophet who oversaw the transition of Yisrael to a king.

Here is the account:

“¹ Now it came to pass when Shemuel was old that he made his sons judges over Yisrael. ² The name of his firstborn was Joel, and the name of his second, Abijah; they were judges in Beersheba. ³ But his sons did not walk in his ways; they turned aside after dishonest gain, took bribes, and perverted justice. ⁴ Then all the elders of Yisrael gathered together and came to Shemuel at Ramah, ⁵ and said to him, Look, you are old, and your sons do not walk in your ways. Now make us a king to judge us like all the nations. ⁶ But the thing displeased Shemuel when they said, Give us a king to judge us. So Shemuel prayed to YHWH. ⁷ And YHWH said to Shemuel, Heed the voice of the people in all that they say to you; for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected Me, that I should not reign over them. ⁸ According to all the works which they have

done since the day that I brought them up out of Egypt, even to this day - with which they have forsaken Me and served other gods - so they are doing to you also. ⁹ Now therefore, heed their voice. However, you shall solemnly forewarn them, and show them the behavior of the king who will reign over them. ¹⁰ So Shemuel told all the words of YHWH to the people who asked him for a king. ¹¹ And he said, This will be the behavior of the king who will reign over you: He will take your sons and appoint them for his own chariots and to be his horsemen, and some will run before his chariots. ¹² He will appoint captains over his thousands and captains over his fifties, will set some to plow his ground and reap his harvest, and some to make his weapons of war and equipment for his chariots. ¹³ He will take your daughters to be perfumers, cooks, and bakers. ¹⁴ And he will take the best of your fields, your vineyards, and your olive groves, and give them to his servants. ¹⁵ He will take a tenth of your grain and your vintage, and give it to his officers and servants. ¹⁶ And he will take your male servants, your female servants, your finest young men, and your donkeys, and put them to his work. ¹⁷ He will take a tenth of your sheep. And you will be his servants. ¹⁸ And you will cry out in that day because of your king whom you have chosen for yourselves, and YHWH will not hear you in that day. ¹⁹ Nevertheless the people refused to obey the voice of Shemuel; and they said, No, but we will have a king over us, ²⁰ that we also may be like all the nations, and that our king may judge us and go out before us and fight our battles. ²¹ And Shemuel heard all the words of the people, and he repeated them in the hearing of YHWH. ²² So YHWH said to Shemuel, Heed their voice, and make them a king.” 1 Shemuel 8:1-22

Even though YHWH was their King, his physical priests had failed to properly represent him, in the past. While Shemuel judged righteously, they did not want anything to do with his sons.

Despite the fact that YHWH warned them they would be oppressed by their king, the people still wanted a man.

That desire was deemed to be wicked by YHWH.

Read the account when the first king named Saul was anointed as King.

“¹⁶ Now therefore, stand and see this great thing which YHWH will do before your eyes: ¹⁷ Is today not the wheat harvest? I will call to YHWH, and He will send thunder and rain, that you may perceive and see that your wickedness is great, which you have done in the sight of YHWH, in asking a king for yourselves. ¹⁸ So Shemuel called to YHWH, and YHWH sent thunder and rain that day; and all the people greatly feared YHWH and Shemuel. ¹⁹ And all the people said to Shemuel, Pray for your servants to YHWH your Elohim, that we may not die; for we have added to all our sins the evil of asking a king for ourselves. ²⁰ Then Shemuel said to the people, Do not fear. You have done all this wickedness; yet do not turn aside from following YHWH, but serve YHWH with all your heart. ²¹ And do not turn aside; for then you would go after empty things which cannot profit or deliver, for they are nothing. ²² For YHWH will not forsake His people, for His great Name’s sake, because it has pleased YHWH to make you His people. ²³ Moreover, as for me, far be it from me that I should sin against YHWH in ceasing to pray for you; but I will teach you the good and the right way. ²⁴ Only fear YHWH, and serve Him in truth with all your heart; for consider what great things He has done for you. ²⁵ But if you still do wickedly, you shall be swept away, both you and your king.” 1 Shemuel 12:16-25

Now that’s what I call climate change. It doesn’t rain during the wheat harvest, and the people knew it. YHWH was not happy with them, because it was a rejection of Him.

Well, they got what they asked for. The first king, although he looked the part, ended up being a failure.

The second King David, although flawed, was a king who was zealous for YHWH, and sought righteousness.

Sadly, his son, and the majority of the kings who followed in the House of Judah and the House of Yisrael were evil. From a reading of the Scriptures it appears that in the combined kingdoms, out of 39 kings and 1 queen, arguably only 5 of them were really righteous.

Not very good odds.

The problem is, they got sloppy, and they acted like the kings of the other nations.

The kings of Yisrael were given specific instructions to make them set apart from other kings.

We already mentioned that the king was not to be a foreigner. That is because foreigners served false gods, and would not be rooted in the Covenant. The King needed to be circumcised on the eighth day, and raised within the Covenant.

Here are some additional commandments directed specifically at the kings. *“¹⁶ . . . He shall not multiply horses for himself, nor cause the people to return to Egypt to multiply horses, for YHWH has said to you, ‘You shall not return that way again.’ ¹⁷ Neither shall he multiply wives for himself, lest his heart turn away; nor shall he greatly multiply silver and gold for himself. ¹⁸ Also it shall be, when he sits on the throne of his kingdom, that he shall write for himself a copy of this Torah in a Scroll, from the one before the priests, the Levites. ¹⁹ And it shall be with him, and he shall read it all the days of his life, that he may learn to fear YHWH his Elohim and be careful to observe all the words of this law and these statutes, ²⁰ that his heart may not be lifted above his brethren, that he may not turn aside from the commandment to the right hand or*

to the left, and that he may prolong his days in his kingdom, he and his children in the midst of Yisrael.” Deuteronomy 17:16-20

All of these commandments for kings were intended to keep them humble, and focused on the Covenant path. Imagine having a king who actually did these things. A king who studied the Torah and focused on YHWH continually. A king who diligently obeyed the Commandments.

While Solomon was given wisdom, he chose to disobey these specific commands, and his actions caused the Kingdom to be divided into two houses.

The king of Yisrael was not supposed to accumulate many wives. Solomon had 700 wives and 300 concubines! (1 Kings 11:3)

The king of Yisrael was not supposed to have horses and chariots like Pharaoh, in order to project pride and power. He was supposed to ride on a donkey. That would demonstrate that the king was a humble servant who relied upon the power of Elohim.

The Scriptures record: *“Now Solomon had 4,000 stalls for horses and chariots and 12,000 horsemen, and he stationed them in the chariot cities and with the king in Jerusalem.” 2 Chronicles 9:25*

We know that he accumulated great wealth and heavily taxed the people. That was the main reason for the split in the Kingdom after his death.

We don't know if Solomon ever obeyed the Command to write his own Torah Scroll. It appears not to be the case, because he definitely did not diligently obey the commandments for kings.

While those specific commands were directed to a king of Yisrael, we are all commanded to “diligently keep the commands,” and “diligently obey the voice” of YHWH.

I quoted Exodus 15:26 at last week at the UnitedinYah health event.

“If you diligently heed the voice of YHWH your Elohim and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am YHWH who heals you.” Exodus 15:26

Notice the “if-then” relationship?

Obedience to the terms of the Covenant was a condition to receiving the benefits of the Covenant. This is perfectly reasonable.

If you look in the Hebrew you will read “shamar shamar” or “shema shema” in certain passages requiring diligence.

YHWH does not stutter. He repeats Himself to emphasizing the importance of the matter. The translators understood that, so they add the word “diligent” to emphasize the point. (see Deuteronomy 6:17 and Deuteronomy 28:1)

Remember when we talked about the fact that “perfect peace” in Isaiah 26:3 was “shalom shalom.”

Well, YHWH wants us to “perfectly hear” (shema shema), and “perfectly keep” (shamar shamar) the Commands.

We all have been exposed to “greasy grace” in our Christian walks, but YHWH demands perfection.

I was working on Chapter 19 of the Leaving Babylon book before I tuned into the Queen's funeral, and that chapter is about understanding renewal in the Covenant journey.

I discussed how Noah was described as "perfect" in his generation. (Genesis 6:9)

We too, should be perfect in our generation, if we want to serve Elohim.

YHWH specifically provides: *"My eyes shall be on the faithful of the land, that they may dwell with me; he who walks in a perfect way, he shall serve me."* Psalm 101:6

Here is what we should be proclaiming every day. *"I will behave wisely in a perfect way. Oh, when will You come to me? I will walk within my house with a perfect heart."* Psalm 101:2

The word for perfect is "tamiym."

It doesn't mean that you never made a mistake or sinned, as most westerners view the word.

It means "blameless" and "unblemished." It is the condition we should all find ourselves after being washed and covered by the blood of Messiah. (Revelation 1:5)

Sadly, so many Christians "plead the blood," and then go continue in sin, because they refuse to obey the Torah. Yahushua shed His blood to cleanse us, and the point is to stay clean.

The way that we stay clean is by being washed by the water of the Word. In other words, we read and hear the Word. We then let it flow in, and through, and out of us by our righteous actions.

When we remain in obedience, we walk perfectly before Elohim. This is a hallmark of His covenant people.

Remember what YHWH instructed Abram when He changed his name to Abraham before the Covenant of Circumcision?

“¹ When Abram was ninety-nine years old, YHWH appeared to Abram and said to him, I am El Shaddai; walk before Me and be blameless. (tamiym) ² And I will make My covenant between Me and you, and will multiply you exceedingly.” Genesis 17:1-2

There’s that word again – “tamiym.”

It was a requirement of the Covenant, and it still is. YHWH never changed His mind regarding what He was looking for in a Covenant people. He even sent His Son to heal them and cleanse them. He then sent the Spirit to empower them. So people today have absolutely no excuse for not walking before Elohim and being blameless.

Sadly, not many Christians are taught to be perfect. In fact, most churches are like going to an alcoholics anonymous meeting. You know when they stand up and describe themselves as an alcoholic, even when they have overcome the addiction and been set free?

How many Christians describe themselves as sinners, even after they have supposedly been set free by Jesus?

Talk about a negative confession!

No wonder so many Christians are enslaved by sin. They have never been taught the definition of sin, and the definition of righteousness as found in the Torah.

If you have repented (turned) from your sinful ways, cleansed by the blood of Yahushua, and are walking with Elohim, and following His righteous instructions, you are no longer a Gentile. You are Yisrael.

That is why the Appointed Times are keyed to the “tequfot” (turns).

They remind us to “turn” (repent) to YHWH and walk perfectly before Him. They remind us to meet with Him, and serve Him.

Through the work of Yahushua, and the filling of the Set Apart Spirit, you can walk perfect before YHWH. The question is whether you will put in the effort.

When I watched the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II, I was enthralled at the precision, and dare I say “perfection?”

I was watching intently at every detail, looking for a mistake. I’m sure there were mistakes, but from my view it was flawless.

I’ll be honest with you. After the conclusion of the event, I was overwhelmed with emotion. Not because the Queen was dead, but by the fact that YHWH expects that type of service from us.

If people can put that level of diligence and perfection into serving a deceased Queen, what should we be doing for the Living Elohim – the King of the Universe?

That’s something to really consider and ponder.

Do we put any effort into our service, or do we simply go through the motions?

I wonder if any of those people involved in the Queen's funeral considered the contrast, and would be willing to apply the same effort to serving YHWH?

Yesterday I met with some elders of a local church that are going through a split, and they were so saddened about the decrease in numbers.

I reminded them that numbers don't matter. It is the quality of the servants, and whether they bear fruit.

They were concerned about the fact that their pastor resigned, but I reminded them that their fellowship is about a community, and there are seven days in a week.

It is not about listening to a man for half an hour on Sunday. It's about walking with Elohim every day. The focus is not on a man, it is on YHWH.

It just goes to show how desperately people want to follow a man, when they really need to set their eyes on YHWH.

Last week, I watched thousands of sincere Brits express their love and devotion toward a royal family that actually changed their name to Windsor a hundred years ago, because their real name Saxe-Coburg-Gotha, sounded too German.

Of course, that's because it was German.

Indeed, the father of King Charles III was from the Danish-German house of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Glücksburg.

So there is German through his mother and his father. Interesting lineage for a British King who was circumcised by a Jewish Rabbi, by the way.

Nevertheless, most people don't look behind the curtain. They just want a king to rule over them, like the Yisraelites.

It is amazing how people are so quick to follow, adore and even worship a man, when we already have a King - Messiah Yahushua.

I was amazed at the people who looked to President Trump as a savior, and still do. From what I have seen and witnessed, he does not seem to know the Scriptures, and certainly did not write his own Torah Scroll. He has accumulated great wealth and I cannot see him riding a donkey. He is the antithesis of humility.

Honestly, this is all a huge Babylonian distraction, especially because I know a King Who did ride on a donkey!

If you are in the Kingdom of Elohim, then YHWH is your King, and we look forward to the coronation and installment of His Son on this planet. YHWH and His Son are both Kings of different Kingdoms. YHWH rules the heavens, and Yahushua will rule in this physical dimension.

Did you know that Yom Teruah was the day when the reigns of the Kings of Judah were reckoned from?

Remember that the coronation date is different from an ascension date. A king or queen ascends to the throne upon the death of the reigning monarch. The coronation usually takes place months later, after the mourning is concluded. For consistency sake, Judah used Yom Teruah as the controlling date.

That is why Yahushua was born on Yom Teruah, and likely anointed by the “Wise men” when He was a child on that date a couple years later.

We are now just days away from Yom Teruah, which will begin after sunset on Tuesday, September 27, 2022 and will continue until sunset, Wednesday, September 28, 2022.

How interesting that many are anticipating the coronation of King Charles III, now that Queen Elizabeth II has been laid to rest.

I have encouraged people to watch that coronation ceremony closely, because I believe it all has prophetic significance.

The service will harken back to Solomon and Zadok, and the Scepter and Orb represent the rule of “Jesus” over the earth. The throne that he will sit upon includes the “Stone of Scone,” claimed to be the stone that Jacob laid on at Beth El. The British Monarchy has both a military and a religious element.

The House of Windsor also claims a direct link to King David. This led to the belief in British Israelism. The Masonic symbolism is everywhere with this monarchy, if you have eyes to see. So the prophetic implications and possibilities are all quite profound.

With King Charles III being one of the founders of the World Economic Forum, and one of the chief architects of the Great Reset, we are sure to see him working hard to complete the beast system.

In the meantime, it is important that we maintain our focus on honoring our coming King.

We should focus on diligent obedience and perfecting our walk and our service..

It is no coincidence that Yisrael was described as an army when leaving Egypt, and the entire process of camping and marching through the wilderness was like a military operation.

Of course, Yisrael was the army of YHWH. They went into battle with their King leading them.

A good military is defined by its' discipline, and discipline is required for perfect service.

When the trumpet sounds on Yom Teruah, will you be ready to serve the King with oil in your lamps, or will you be caught sleeping and unprepared?
